1

Regular Dusting

Use a soft, dry cloth or a microfiber duster to regularly remove dust and debris from the surface of your faux leather furniture.

Use a Mild Soap Solution

Rinse and Wipe Dry

After cleaning with soap, dampen another cloth with clean water to wipe away any soap residue. Follow up by drying the area with a dry cloth.



5

Avoid Direct Sunlight

Keep faux leather furniture out of direct sunlight to prevent fading and drying out over time.
